Grading visits to visitor attractions are carried out every two years, with details of the grading system set out in Visit Scotland's Best Practice Guide, available online. An overall percentage of between 78-84% is required for a 4 Star grade, with a minimum of 85% being the standard for the 5 Star rating.
